

# APPLETON HEALTH DEPARTMENT QUARTERLY REPORT October 1 – December 31, 2020

# **Executive Summary**

The Health Department's day-to-day activities for the fourth quarter of 2020 are enumerated in the attached report. The Department continues to work toward fulfilling the goals of our Department, keeping in mind the belief statements that support and enhance our mission statement.

## "Plays a vital role assessing and assuring the health needs and trade practices in the community"

City Sealer Eric Maggio and Health Officer Kurt Eggebrecht met virtually with the nine contacted Consortium municipalities of Ashwaubenon, Berlin, Fox Crossing, Kaukauna, Kimberly, Little Chute, New London, Ripon, and Waupaca. The yearly meetings provide a chance to discuss the program and answer any questions about work provided during the year. The municipalities remain pleased with the work Weights and Measures staff has provided and the partnership of sharing services. All work was completed at a high level and the program continues to be a successful partnership.

## "Provides services to protect and promote the health and well-being of the citizen and consumer"

Since spring, Environmentalist Steve Kihl and Ryan Mathew have been working with several city residents and staff at Neenah Paper to resolve a noise complaint coming from their paper facility located in the flats. Neenah Paper had also received several separate complaints from additional residents. The noise was being generated by the thermo oxidizer and was emanating from the stack leading from this equipment. Neenah Paper worked with two different engineering consultants over the summer to come up with a solution. In early September, a stack silencer was purchased with delivery and install expected in November. In mid-November, the silencer was installed and a significant reduction in the noise was noticed immediately. Residents who previously had concerns were contacted by Neenah Paper and/or the Health Department. These residents confirmed that they no longer could hear the noise and expressed their gratitude for the addressing the issue.

### "Communicates with the public on health and consumer related issues"

In December of 2019, the nation was made aware of a small outbreak occurring in Wuhan China. Since March 16, 2020 we have activated the Public Health Emergency Preparedness Plans and opened the Appleton Emergency Operations Center (EOC). During the 4<sup>th</sup> quarter, the focus of the EOC has been testing and the beginning stages of vaccine distribution planning.

On October 15, a new testing site opened to the public at Appleton North High School. Due to the need to start a new testing site in Appleton right away, we opened on a Thursday and tested through Saturday during the first week were approved by the National Guard. After Saturday, the testing site ran Monday through Wednesday from 8am to 4pm beginning October 19, 2020 through January 6, 2021. The testing site at Appleton North was a drive-thru test site, free to anyone that showed up. There was an enormous amount of collaboration between several agencies to make that testing site possible and successful. The Appleton North testing site tested 14,180 individuals between October 15<sup>th</sup> and January 6, 2021. Testing is still a critical component in the response to COVID-19, so continued testing at the Fox Cities Exhibition Center will begin in 2021.

Starting in November, vaccination planning started to slowly begin. In Appleton, we started to review our plans for mass clinics knowing they will need to be adapted for locations other than schools and Northland Mall, previously used for H1N1. While looking through the plans, our team quickly identified a critical need for a vaccine coordinator due to the overwhelmingly full plates of Health Department staff already. This position has assisted with vaccine distribution.

December 11<sup>th</sup>, the U.S. Food and Drug Administration issued the first emergency use authorization (EUA) for the Pfizer vaccine for the preventions of COVID-19 in individuals 16 years of age and older. Shortly after, on December 18<sup>th</sup>, the Moderna vaccine was issued an emergency use authorization for individuals 18 years and older. Planning for vaccine distribution started to rapidly change. Several webinars and meetings were arranged in December to begin educating local public health of the phases for vaccine distribution and vaccine will be sent to vaccinators.
