- 100% of clinics felt that the ROR program has enhanced the provider/patient relationship (Fidelity Survey)

Parent Survey Results

- 234 out of 235 Caregivers reported receiving a book at WCV.
- 107 Caregivers reported this child has already received 4 or more books at their WCVs.
- 52 of 75 who weren't already prepared to use books at home reported feeling a little or a lot more prepared to use books at home with their child after this WCV (52 out of 235 total survey participants).
- 93 of 127 Caregivers who didn't already have an understanding about developmentally appropriate ways to use books reported feeling a better understanding of developmentally appropriate ways their child would use books after their WCV.
- 133 of 146 of Caregivers who didn't already read at least 30 minutes a day to their child reported they would or might try reading to their child for at least 30 minutes a day after their WCV.

- 99% Caregivers reported receiving a book at WCV.
