



Wiechquaes Keck


108"x30"x25" 2018 Silver Maple \$6,000

The words Wiechquaes Keck honors the Native American Munsee tribe and is associated with the area of land between the Hudson and Long Island Sound. Pelham was originally called Wiechquaeskeck by Indigenous peoples originally inhabiting the land.

My sculptures are physical, three-dimensional suspensions of time depicting a moment where dissolve/expansion of nature occurs through a technological sieve. The rearranged compositions of tree refuse via fragmentation portrays tears in the spacetime continuum; a confusion of history recorded and inherent in nature, compromised by pixelated digitization and artificial perversion.

In submission to Acre of Art, I propose creation of a new installation as an extension of the natural/human built environment found intersecting natural/urban/rural land and cityscapes.



Prairie Song

4.0'W x 8.0'H x 2.0'D 300# 2017 aluminum and steel, powdercoated $\$8,\!800$

This sculpture is a piece in the Quarks Series, but it is more organic and painted a rich, earth brown, with the red segments and wire representing the energy of life on the Prairie, and the explosion of its growth in the spring. The Quarks Series includes 17 sculptures inspired by Fermilab - the particle collider that investigates the science of matter, space, and time. The collision images are the basis for the Series, which explores mass that is exploding and creating disintegrating arcs - the large segments represent mass, and the rod represents that mass leaving one area, and exploding into another...


Flip Flop

6.0'W x 8.0'H x 3.0'D ? 2017 aluminum painted and powdercoated \$17,500

Flip Flop is an interactive sculpture made up to two sections. Viewers are invited to 'enter' the sculpture by walking into the sculpture, and being enveloped in the piece, changing the sound quality and visually, experiencing the sculpture from the inside, a 'Womblike' experience.

The forms also create a beautiful sundial form producing striking shadows.

Nike

8'L x 6'W x 8.5'H 2018 stainless steel \$20,000

Nike was the Greek goddess of victory. This abstraction references the Nike of Samothrace, a personification of elegance and invincibility. As in that sculpture when rediscovered, the head and arms are missing, but the body and spreading wings, the essence, are intact.

I've been using converging arcs in my work and wanted to continue that investigation. I also have wanted to increase the density of information in my stainless steel forms. That is happening here. Converging arcs make a "V" form, which works well for torsos and wings, while referencing the "V" for victory. Nike's Roman equivalent was Victoria.

While making the sculpture I began to notice and work with references to classic automotive badges and grilles among other things. There is a resemblance to side pipes and headers in "Nike" and the expressions of power and grace that go with them.

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
