

Emergency Preparedness & Response


- Conducted the annual Emergency Operations Center exercise with all city departments in October.



- Operations Supervisor, Eric Maggio, attended the 2025 Wisconsin Weights & Measures Association (WWMA) Annual Conference, held October 14–16, 2025, at the Tundra Lodge and Conference Center in Green Bay, Wisconsin. The conference serves as a required state-level training for weights and measures officials and fulfills the obligation for ongoing professional education throughout the year. The agenda focused on regulatory and program updates, DATCP coordination, peer roundtables, and system improvements, including a WinWam workshop to enhance inspection documentation and data integrity. A significant portion of the conference was dedicated to formal technical training in Small Capacity Scale inspection and testing, led by national subject matter expert Aaron Yanker from Colorado Weights & Measures.
- The conference also included committee reports and the annual business meeting, where Eric Maggio was elected President of the Wisconsin Weights & Measures Association. In this leadership role, he will help guide statewide training priorities and strengthen collaboration across municipal and state programs. It was also announced that the 2026 WWMA Annual Conference will be held in Neenah, Wisconsin.
