The collection of specific data and/or information is difficult because of the casual and drop-in nature of a public park and recreation facilities such as playground equipment. The general utilization of the park and playground equipment is monitored in several ways, including: communications with residents through neighborhood meetings/gatherings; regular inspections performed by field staff who inspect the playground equipment for maintenance needs, activity patterns, etc.; and anecdotal feedback from neighbors, residents, public safety personnel, etc.
