Appleton Grand Chute Intergovernmental Agreement

As you are aware, the City of Appleton (City) and the Grand Chute Sanitary District No. 1 (District) are sharing infrastructure, software and an FCC license as part of the construction and use of the advance metering infrastructure (AMI) system of water meters and the reading thereof. In order to accomplish that goal, the parties have crafted an intergovernmental cooperation agreement. The agreement addresses the following areas:

- <u>Tower Ownership</u> the City shall maintain ownership of two of the three towers, the District one. This complies with Public Service Commission requirements, and the parties will not remove or relocate any of the towers without working with the other to maintain uninterrupted use of the system
- Shared Costs Exhibit A attached hereto outlines the system costs and the allocation thereof.
- Indemnification there is a mutual indemnification clause
- <u>Dispute Resolution</u> the agreement provides for non-binding mediation prior to any court action being filed
- Term of the Agreement the agreement remains in effect so long as both parties are using the AMI system
- <u>Disposal of Assets</u>
  - o 180 day notice of termination
  - o Transfer of the FCC license
  - Right to continue using any towers belonging to the other party that are necessary for the continued use of the system
  - Agreement to purchase any integral infrastructure assets owned by the terminating party
  - Depreciation of assets
