

THE NEIGHBORHOOD GRANT PROGRAM & APPLICATION

Updated May 26, 2016

Background and Overview

The Neighborhood Grant Program (TNGP) is open to all Appleton registered neighborhoods that participate in the City's Neighborhood Program. The grants assist in strengthening and sustaining the social network of the Appleton community and may be applied to projects that enhance cultural, beautification, recreation, education, neighborhood cleanup, neighborhood safety, and family/youth issues through resident-driven activities within each neighborhood. The grants encourage and support neighborhood groups to invest in and build on the existing strengths and assets of each neighborhood. Grants are intended to spur small, grassroots community efforts and improve the quality of life of each neighborhood through resident involvement. TNGP provides an opportunity for residents to partner with the City, promote the value of community, and support strong and stable neighborhoods throughout the City of Appleton.

How to Apply

Typically, the grant applications will be processed twice per year on August 1 and February 1. However, staff shall reserve the option, but not an obligation, to process applications at other times when warranted. Applications should be submitted to the Community and Economic Development Department (CEDD) by the target date, unless arrangements have been made with CEDD staff ahead of time. In the event a project takes more than six months to complete, the neighborhood will not have to re-apply unless substantial changes to the project are proposed. All grants will be subject to funding source(s) and availability.

Grant Requirements and Scoring Criteria

All grants will be subject to the requirements of the funding source (ex: Community Development Block Grant (CDBG), General Fund, partner businesses, etc.). The following are additional requirements and scoring criteria for award:

- Only registered neighborhoods will be considered for TNGP grants.
- Each application must have a minimum of three (3) households within the registered neighborhood "signed on" as supporters of the project. Preference will be given to those neighborhoods that have engaged a higher percentage of their residents.
- Preference will be given to neighborhoods that have actively participated in the programs offered by the City's Neighborhood Program.
- Each grant will be reviewed against how well it would "assist in strengthening and sustaining the social network of the Appleton community."
- Consideration to whether a neighborhood has received TNGP grants in the past and whether the project was completed as proposed will be given.
- Project cannot commence prior to approval of grant award.
- A pre-application meeting with CEDD staff is required.

Grant funds will not be provided directly to the neighborhood. Instead, funds will be paid to the provider of the service/materials directly upon submittal of the proper documentation to CEDD. The City of Appleton Procurement Policy applies to all CDBG and General Fund activities that involve the purchase of equipment, materials, supplies, and/or services. A copy of this policy will be distributed to all TNGP recipients.

Funding Sources

Funds available for TNGP are currently administered through two funding sources, the CDBG program and General Fund. The location and type of project may impact which source(s) could be utilized, as explained below.

Information Specific to the CDBG Program

Qualifying Projects: CDBG funds come with restriction of use area and use type. The attached low and moderate income (LMI) map indicates use areas. The following list is a summary of possible project types that could qualify.

In LMI Areas Only:

- Improvements to "Publically Accessible" property:
 - o Publically accessible is typically a park, school, etc.
 - Examples: benches, lighting, signage, artwork, play equipment, plantings
- Projects that qualify as an "Area Benefit" to all residents of an LMI area:
 - Infrastructure

- Paving of streets/curb & gutter
- Neighborhood facilities
- Commercial facade improvements in primarily residential areas

Spot Blight Removal (does not have to be in LMI area):

- Spot blight removal includes:
 - Demolition of vacant/deteriorated and abandoned building(s)
 - o Physical removal of environmental contaminants
 - Movement of structures to other sites
 - Rehabilitation, only to the extent necessary for safety
 - Historical preservation

Review Process: CEDD staff will perform a review of each application, in accordance with the rules and regulations of the funding source, and offer an analysis to be considered by Community & Economic Development Committee and Common Council. The Community & Economic Development Committee makes a recommendation to the Common Council who makes the final decision on the matter.

Information Specific to the General Fund


Qualifying Projects: Funding from the General Fund is available to all registered neighborhoods, not just those that meet restrictive CDBG criteria. To truly strengthen our entire City, neighborhoods need the tools to connect with their neighbors. Eligible projects could be:

- Polls/surveys of the neighborhood
- Community gatherings
- Other opportunities to promote communication and identify needs

Review Process: Applications will be administratively reviewed by CEDD staff, based on the criteria described above.

^{**}Eligibility for spot blight removal will be considered on a case by case basis.**

5) Describe, in detail, what your proposed project entails (provide map or sketch as appropriate):

The senior center groups relocated to the St. Bernadette Parish School on April 1, 2016, due to the closing of the senior center, known as the Thompson Community Center, located in downtown Appleton. St. Bernadette Parish provided a facility and administration of the senior center, now known as the Thompson Center on Lourdes, Inc. for the past 12 months. With the senior center activities relocating to the St. Bernadette Parish School, the parish hired Gries Archtectural Group Inc. to facilitate recommendations to the City of Appleton to prioritize building modifications to allow for a Change of Use for the senior center to function within the St. Bernadette Parish School. On September 21, 2016, St. Bernadette Parish was granted conditional approval from the

Wisconsin Dept. of Safety and Professional Services to complete the required modifications within 1 year so the Thompson Center on Lourdes, Inc. can continue to function as a senior center within the St. Bernadette Parish School. The St. Bernadette Parish School is owned by St. Bernadette Parish and is not used as a place of worship.

The Life / Safety modification is the most urgent. This modification consists of replacing the existing natural gas generator with an electrical inverter. This inverter will provide power for emergency illumination throughout the facility, including emergency exit pathway lights. This illumination complies with the State and National Building Codes and tests itself on a monthly basis recording all results. It utilizes a rechargable battery and is more efficient than the conventional system.

All light fixtures in the hallways, stairwells and exit paths will be replaced with LED fixtures. Cafeteria lights will be replaced with dimmable LED fixtures.

6) What is the project's anticipated "service area" (area that will benefit from the project)?

This project will benefit all seniors (elderly persons) in Outagamie and the surrounding counties. According to the 2016 Fox Cities Life (Leading Indicators for Excellence) report, in 2014 13.2% of the population in Outagamie County was over 65 years of age with a median annual income of \$35,090. In 2014 Outagamie County reported a 6.3% senior poverty rate. In the same report, Winnebago County reported that 14.7% of the population was over 65 years of age with a median income of \$35,725. In 2014 Winnebago County reported a 7.1% senior poverty rate. Attachment #4 is a map depicting the projected population growth of seniors 65 years and older. As seen in Attachment #4, the average growth rate of seniors is much larger than the average growth rate of the total population.

These participants from across the Fox Cities that utilize the Thompson Center on Lourdes, Inc. are presumed to be in the low to moderate income group. Many of these seniors live on a fixed income and have lost a life partner and many of their closest friends. They are no longer working and many have little to no support system. All seniors in this community are eligible to participate in programs and services at the Thompson Center on Lourdes, Inc.

7) Describe how this project would assist in strengthening and sustaining the social network of the Appleton community:

All seniors in the Fox Valley community are eligible to participate in programs and services at the Thompson Center on Lourdes, Inc. Attachment #5 is a list of all programs and services, with the number of participants, that are provided at the Thompson Center on Lourdes Inc. These activities utilize St. Bernadette School as well as the Thompson Center on Lourdes, Inc..

The Long Term Committee, charged with providing recommendations to the city and surrounding villages, towns, etc,. has recommended that the Thompson Center on Lourdes, Inc. serve as a gateway to our community's aging network, connecting older adults to vital services and activities that can help them stay healthy and independent.

The Thompson Center on Lourdes, Inc. has been working closely with the Aging and Disability Resource Center serving Calumet, Outagamie and Winnebago Counties.

8) What is the estimated total cost of the project? How much is the neighborhood looking for from TNGP? Are there any funding sources other than TNGP? If so, please list other participating individuals/agencies.

Projected total cost is \$60,000.00. The neighborhood is asking for \$60.000.00, There are no other funding sources other than TNGP.

9) Please include an itemized budget (attach price quotes as necessary).

A total of 5 bids were solicited. Pieper Power and Vos Electric Co. declined to bid.

The specific bids received were:

- 1. Faith Technology Total bid amount is \$59,388.00. This bid DOES NOT include motion detection for emergency illumination.
- 2. VanErt Electric Co. Total bid amount is \$63,450.00. This bid DOES include motion detection for emergency illumination. If removed, the total bid amount would be \$53,400.00.
- 3. Enterprise Electric Total bid amount is \$63,300.00. The contractor did not use our itemized bid sheet. Per conversation with Ryan Deraa of Enterprise Electric, motion detection for emergency illumination IS NOT included.

To summarize:

Faith Technology - \$59,388.00 VanErt Electric - \$53,400.00 Enterprise Electric - \$63,300.00

Based on these bids it is recommended that VanErt Electric Co. be awarded this project.

Because this is a remodeling project, the difference between the low bid (\$53,400.00) and the grant application amount (\$60,000.00) is \$6,600.00. This \$6,600.00 would represent a 10% contingency amount for unforeseen problems during construction. See Bid #1, #2 and #3 attached.







Options for Independent Living services the following counties from the Thompson Center on Lourdes Site: Calumet, Fond du Lac, Green Lake, Marquette, Outagamie, Waupaca, Waushara, and Winnebago. Options for Independent Living - empowers people with disabilities to lead independent and productive lives in their community. They provide Advocacy, Peer Support, Independent Living Skills Training, Community Education Options, Residential Assessments and a Medicaid Personnel Care Option. From 10/16 to current there have been 320 calls with 268.5 hours of follow-up and on-site visits.

Easter Seals provides services, education, outreach and advocacy in Outagamie County, so that people with disabilities can live. Learn, work and play in our communities. From 9/1/16 to current 425 visits have taken place. These visits relate to the following:

Parents of children with special needs Incontinence Supplies and Equipment Working with guardians Programs for children with autism Easter Egg Hunt

Aging and Disability Resource Center. (ADRC), – serves Calumet, Outagamie and Waupaca Counties. The ADRC provides assistance / referral in areas such as: disabilities, long-term care, housing, physical and behavioral health, wellness, employment and training for persons with disabilities, transportation, home care caregiver support, nutrition and publicly funded programs. ADRC classes offered since April 2016 are:

Stepping On -20 participants Living Well -14 participants Healthy Living with Diabetes -12 participants Tia Chi -8 consistent participants

Office for the Blind and Visually Impaired, (OBVI) – Serves Calumet, Manitowoc, Menominee, Outagamie, Shawano, and Winnebago Counties. The OBVI provides services to help individuals who are blind or visually impaired to achieve their own goals and independent living. This service relocated to the Thompson Center on Lourdes Nov. 1 2016 and as of this writing participation statistics are not available.

Kids in Motion – The main goal is to enrich the lives of children so that they can achieve new possibilities that were previously unimaginable. These classes are weekly. Currently there are 8 classes with a total average enrollment of 75 children.

Appleton Historical Society – Their mission is to preserve and share the history of Appleton. Current membership is 2053. Presentations are held monthly at St. Bernadette Cafeteria. Average attendance is 100 - 150 people.

St. Bernadette Religious Education – A total of 104 children of grades 7-11 participate in weekly Catholic Religious Education Classes held in the school.

Active Minds – Active Minds is a person learning experience designed to fit the needs of those with early stage dementia or mild memory loss. Active mods creates a unique atmosphere that promotes social communication, healthy living styles and lasting friendships. This service began at the Thompson Center on Lourdes Jan. 1, 2017. There are approximately 40 participants per month.

YMCA Classes held at the Thompson Center on Lourdes. Winter Schedule of Feb 20- April 9 and the Spring Schedule of April 10 – May 28.
