





These guidelines have been established to determine which signs may be administratively approved to be installed within the street right-of-way. Requests for signs not meeting these requirements will be denied. Appeals will be to the Common Council through the Municipal Services Committee.

## **GROUND SIGNS**

No ground signs may be installed within the street right-of-way.

## PROJECTING SIGNS/AWNINGS

Projecting signs meeting the following criteria may be administratively approved to be installed within the street right-of-way:

- 1. Minimum clearance of 10 feet between the bottom of the sign and the normal grade.
- 2. Maximum projection of 4 feet into the street right-of-way.
- 3. Maximum size of sign within the street right-of-way is 35% of the wall size abutting the street frontage, or 350 square feet, whichever is less.
- 4. Maximum size of a changeable copy sign within the street right-of-way is 48 square feet.





## CITY OF APPLETON BANNER POLICY

## A. <u>ATTACHED TO SKYWALKS</u>

No banner shall be attached to any skywalk located within City street right-of-way.

## B. SUSPENDED ACROSS STREET RIGHT-OF-WAY

No banners shall be suspended across street right-of-way.

## C. ATTACHED TO CITY-OWNED STREET LIGHTS

- 1. Requests for installation of banners must be made either by a recognized agency representing the area or from a two-thirds majority of the properties along the proposed route.
- 2. Requesting parties must designate an individual to serve as the contact person with the City.
- 3. Banners may be installed only in areas that are predominantly commercial zoning.
- 4. Banner installation should be consistent with Planning and Development policies, represent an appropriate theme, and not detract from the aesthetics of an area. Plans for banner installation, including color scheme, theme, and spacing must be approved by the Planning Department and Plan Commission before being forwarded to the Municipal Service Committee for issuance of a permit.
- 5. Banner materials (including the brackets) must be approved by the Department of Public Works.
- 6. Banner installation may be done by the Department of Public Works or by private contract. If a private contractor is used, installation plans showing bracket locations and elevations must be provided and approved by the Department of Public Works.
- 7. If performed by the Department of Public Works, the cost of initial banner and bracket installation will be divided equally between the applicant and the City (exclusive of materials).

- 8. All banners and necessary brackets (including replacement parts) to be supplied by the requesting agency.
- 9. Storage of banners to be the responsibility of the requesting party.
- 10. All costs of repair or replacement of banners done by the Department of Public Works will be charged to the requesting agency or designated individual as they are incurred.
- 11. The cost of changeover of banners done by the Department of Public Works will be divided equally between the applicant and the City up to a maximum of twice per year after which all costs will be borne by the applicant.
- 12. Banners will remain the property of the requesting agency.
- 13. The requesting agency will be given 30 day notice of deteriorated banners (in the judgment of the City) after which they will be removed and the cost of removal will be billed to the requesting agency or designated individual.
- 14. Installation of items budgeted by the City for installation are exempt from this policy. (angels, flags, etc.)

## D. <u>ATTACHED TO</u> WE ENERGIES POLES

The above criteria must be met along with written permission from We Energies. New attachments to We Energies will not be approved according to their Pole Attachment Request Policy. Existing attachments covered by agreements dated prior to March 2001, may remain on We Energies poles.

The City of Appleton, in partnership with Appleton, Downtown Inc. Goodwill, and the Fox Cities Cycling Association pilot tested a bike corral in the parking stall at 231 E. College Avenue. Several concerns were raised by Council members prior to the pilot including safety, cleanliness and usage. In response to these concerns, Lawrence University student Katie Rozek conducted a survey throughout the pilot test. She reported out her findings at the September 23, 2014 Municipal Services Committee meeting. As shown in her attached report, no significant safety or cleanliness issues arose and usage averaged 2.8 bikes.

Another issue that was raised was the potential for lost parking revenue due to the conversion of this parking stall into a bike corral. Staff believes that there was no lost parking revenue as the loss of this parking stall reduced the car parking supply by only one spot, but provided parking for an average of 2.8 customers choosing to use bicycles in lieu of cars. As shown in the Walker Parking Study, supply in this zone of the downtown has an overall effective surplus of 26 on-street parking stalls.

Based on the results of the pilot test and the overall surplus identified in the Walker Parking Study, we recommend installation of the bike corral at the same location (231 E. College Avenue) as last year from May 7, 2015 through September 24, 2015.

Intersection traffic control at the Browning Street / Whittier Drive intersection

At the request of a concerned citizen, the Traffic Section has reviewed the traffic control at the intersection of Browning Street and Whittier Drive (it is currently uncontrolled). This individual had general safety concerns regarding this intersection and felt that changes should be made. This is a four-legged intersection that is located about two blocks south of Northland Avenue, and approximately three blocks west of Richmond Street. The land use in the area of this intersection is residential. One approach on Whittier Drive is a cul-de-sac.

In a typical intersection control study, we consider traffic volumes, crash history, safe approach speeds, etc. Browning Street has a measured traffic count of 360 vehicles per day. Whittier Drive does not have any traffic count on record, but considering the street layout and cul-de-sac we comfortably estimate the traffic count to be below 200 vehicles per day. No crash records were found for the recent five year period of 2009 through 2013. The approach speeds were checked on the Whittier Drive, and are estimated at 10 mph. Both streets are classified as *local*.

More relevant, however, is that the *Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices*, for the sake of consistency, states that intersection control should be installed at uncontrolled intersections which are located in predominantly controlled areas (stops, yields, signals). We have interpreted this to mean that if more then 75% of the four-legged intersections in a particular area (whose boundaries are typically defined by collector or arterial roadways) are controlled, the remaining uncontrolled four-legged intersections should have an appropriate form of control added. While there are several uncontrolled T-intersections in the vicinity, this subject intersection is the only four-legged intersection in this area that remains uncontrolled.

Based on the above, I recommend *yield* control be implemented at this location. Based on traffic counts and street layout, I recommend Whittier Drive *yield* to Browning Street.

### To accomplish this, the following ordinance action is required:

1. Create: "Install yield signs on Whittier Drive at Browning Street."



Recommended parking changes on Winslow Avenue between Conkey St and Progress Drive.

The City was contacted by Pro Label, Inc., located in the Northeast Industrial Park at the northwest corner of Winslow Avenue and Progress Drive, about some on street parking issues effecting their operations. The issue they are having is that their own employees are parking on Winslow Avenue and crowding the driveway that services the semi deliveries to their loading docks. Pro Label does not have enough capacity in their parking lot to handle the overlap of employee parking during shift change times. Based on observations, this can result in over 10 cars parked on the street.

Unaware of the City having responsibility for parking restriction signs and ordinances, Pro Label did install their own signs to restrict the on-street parking near their service drive. If the recommended parking restrictions are approved, the privately owned parking signs will be replaced by official city-owned signs.

The City reviewed the extent of on-street parking affecting other businesses and the operation of the street. While the Winslow Avenue on-street parking crowds both sides of the street and is close to Progress Drive, we do not feel any additional restrictions are necessary at this time. If the amount of on-street parking increases and/or complications with street operations arise, additional restrictions may be implemented in the future. This would likely involve restricting on-street parking to only one side of the street on Winslow Avenue, as well as restrictions at Progress Drive intersection.



As such, we are recommending enacting permanent ordinances to restrict parking near the Pro Label service driveway.

### To accomplish this, the following ordinance action is required:

1. Create: "Parking be prohibited on the north side of Winslow Avenue from a point 195 feet west of Progress Drive to a point 300 feet west of Progress Drive."

Follow-up on 90-Day Trial

Back in December of 2014, the Traffic Section initiated a 90-day trial to create & modify a number of parking restrictions in the area south of St. Francis Xavier Middle School. The intersection control on Morrison Street at McArthur Street was also changed to *stop* control. Please see the attached information that was mailed to residents.

So far, the feedback we have received regarding this project has been mostly positive. Additionally, our observations would suggest the changes have improved traffic flow and safety.

Based on this, I recommend enacting the permanent ordinances as implemented in the 90-day trial.

### To accomplish this, the following ordinance action is required:

### **Intersection Control Ordinance:**

1. Create: "Replace Yield signs with Stop signs on Morrison Street and McArthur Street."

### Parking Ordinance:

- 1. Repeal Ord. 87-91-A: "Parking be prohibited during school hours on both sides of North Morrison Street from McArthur Street to Greenfield Street."
- 2. Create: "Stopping, standing and parking be prohibited, on school days from 11:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., on the north side of Greenfield Street from Morrison Street to a point 25 feet east of Morrison Street."
- 3. *Create:* "Stopping, standing and parking be prohibited, on school days from 11:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., on the south side of Greenfield Street from Morrison Street to Drew Street."
- 4. *Create:* "Stopping, standing and parking be prohibited, on school days from 11:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., on the west side of Morrison Street from Greenfield Street to a point 20 feet south of Greenfield Street."
- 5. Create: "Stopping, standing and parking be prohibited, on school days from 11:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., on the west side of Morrison Street from a point 20 feet north of McArthur Street to a point 25 feet south of McArthur Street."
- 6. Create: "Stopping, standing and parking be prohibited, on school days from 11:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., on the east side of Morrison Street from McArthur Street to Greenfield Street."
- 7. Create: "Stopping, standing and parking be prohibited, on school days from 11:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., on the east side of Morrison Street from Pershing Street to McArthur Street."

- 10. *Create:* "Stopping, standing and parking be prohibited, on school days from 11:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., on the south side of McArthur Street from Morrison Street to a point 275 feet east of Morrison Street."





### **GENERAL INFORMATION**

Owner: Ronald Kurey

**Applicant:** Martenson & Eisele, Inc. c/o Gary Zahringer

**Address/Parcel #:** East of North Meade Street (part of parcel #31-1-9310-15)

**Petitioner's Request:** The applicant is requesting a Rezoning to change the Zoning Map from the AG Agricultural District to R-1A Single-Family District for part of the subject parcel. The request is being made to accommodate use of the existing barn buildings for storage purposes and future construction of a residence.

### **BACKGROUND**

The applicant's site consists of 4.779 acres on the western part of parcel #31-1-9310-15. The entire parcel is 13.33 acres and located east of North Meade Street and north of East Broadway Drive. This area was annexed from the Town of Center in 2006 (Kurey Annexation). The newly annexed territory was assigned a temporary zoning classification of AG Agricultural District, which was made permanent after ninety (90) days pursuant to Section 23-65(e)(3) of the Municipal Code. The two barn buildings were constructed while the subject parcel was in the Town of Center and have remained since the time of annexation. There was also a dwelling located on the site, but it was razed prior to annexation.

On March 16, 2015, the Board of Zoning Appeals voted to approve variance requests to the Municipal Code sections specified below and to allow the existing buildings at the current dimensions to remain, contingent on any future parcel having a minimum size of three (3) acres.

- Section 23-43(d)(1) No accessory building shall be established on a lot prior to the principal building.
- Section 23-43(d)(6) Only one (1) detached garage may be permitted on a lot whose principal use is single family.
- Section 23-43(f)(1)(i)(2) The maximum total combined gross floor area of all detached accessory buildings shall be one thousand six hundred (1,600) square feet.
- Section 23-43(f)(1)(h) The maximum height of an accessory building shall not exceed fifteen (15) feet.

A two-lot Certified Survey Map (CSM) was submitted in conjunction with the rezoning request to create a lot consistent with the proposed rezoning. The remnant parcel would be combined with the adjacent

parcel to the east (#31-1-9310-16), which is under the same ownership. CSMs are administratively reviewed and approved by City staff.

### **STAFF ANALYSIS**

**Existing Conditions:** The subject area is currently developed with 2,586 square foot and 3,807 square foot barn buildings and a gravel driveway.

**Proposed Zoning Classifications:** The purpose of the R-1A Single-Family District is to provide for, and maintain, residential areas characterized predominately by single family detached dwellings on larger sized lots while protecting residential neighborhoods from the intrusion of incompatible non-residential land uses.

**Zoning Ordinance Review Criteria:** Based on initial CSM review, the proposed lot meets the applicable development standards for the R-1A Single-Family District, per Section 23-92(g) of the Municipal Code.

The variance granted by Board of Zoning Appeals resolves the use and dimensional issues presented by the existing barn buildings. As a result, these buildings may remain at their current dimensions and be used for storage purposes (like a garage) in the R-1A Single-Family District, as proposed.

### **Surrounding Zoning Classification and Land Uses:**

North: Town of Center. The adjacent land uses to the north are currently a mix of single-family residential and agricultural uses.

South: AG Agricultural District. The adjacent land uses to the south are currently agricultural.

East: AG Agricultural District. The adjacent land uses to the east are currently agricultural.

West: Town of Center. The adjacent land uses to the west are currently single-family residential.

**General Information:** A rezoning is often triggered by development proposals or changing circumstances in the City. In this case, the desire to divide parcel #31-1-9310-15 and sell the subject property prompted the applicant to submit the rezoning request. A prospective buyer plans to build a residence on the property in the future.

**Appleton Comprehensive Plan 2010-2030:** The City of Appleton *Comprehensive Plan 2010-2030* identifies this area for future one and two-family residential uses. The proposed R-1A Single-Family District rezoning is consistent with the Future Land Use Map. Listed below are related excerpts from the City's *Comprehensive Plan 2010-2030*.

### *Goal 1 – Community Growth*

Appleton will continue to provide opportunities for residential, commercial and industrial growth, including appropriate redevelopment sites within the downtown and existing neighborhoods, and greenfield development sites at the City's edge.

OBJECTIVE 5.3 Housing and Neighborhoods:

Provide a range of housing styles that meet the needs and appeal to all segments of the community.

### OBJECTIVE 10.1 Land Use:

Provide an adequate supply of suitable land meeting the demand for development of various land uses.

**Standards for Zoning Map Amendments:** Per Section 23-65(d)(3) of the Municipal Code, all recommendations for Official Zoning Map amendments shall be consistent with the adopted plans, goals, and policies of the City and with the intent of this zoning ordinance. Related excerpts are listed below.

- a. Prior to making a recommendation on a proposed rezoning, the Plan Commission shall make a finding to determine if the following conditions exist. No rezoning of land shall be approved prior to finding at least one (1) of the following:
  - 1. The request for a zone change is in conformance with the Comprehensive Plan for the City of Appleton. The rezoning request is in conformance with the Comprehensive Plan 2010-2030, as the Future Land Use Map identifies this area for future one and two-family residential uses.
  - 2. A study submitted by the applicant that indicates that there has been an increase in the demand for land in the requested zoning district, and as a result, the supply of land within the City mapped as such on the Official Zoning Map, is inadequate to meet the demands for such development.
  - 3. Proposed amendments cannot be accommodated by sites already zoned in the City due to lack of transportation, utilities or other development constraints, or the market to be served by the proposed use cannot be effectively served by the location of the existing zoning district(s).
  - 4. There is an error in the code text or zoning map as enacted.
- b. In addition to the findings required to be made by subsection (a), findings shall be made by the Plan Commission on each of the following matters based on the evidence presented:
  - 1. The adequacy of public facilities such as transportation, utilities and other required public services to serve the proposed site. The transportation network should be able to accommodate the proposed rezoning. The subject site is not currently served by City sewer and water. It will take other development in the surrounding area to justify extending it to the subject site, but there is no specific timeline set. Therefore, obtaining well/septic permits from Outagamie County would be needed for future residential use, until such time that City sewer and water becomes available. Notification would be given whenever City sewer and water becomes available, and the future residence would need to connect within thirty days of such a notice. The property owner and prospective buyer have been made aware of this matter.
  - 2. The effect of the proposed rezoning on surrounding uses. The barn buildings already exist and currently are accessory uses that are incidental to the raising of field crops. Changing their use to storage (like a garage) should not impact surrounding properties. Also, future

construction of a residence would be similar to the large-lot, single-family residential uses located to the west and north of the subject site.

**Review Criteria:** Based upon the above analysis, it would appear the criteria established by Section 23-65(d)(3) Zoning Amendments has been satisfied.




- Department of Public Works Comments: Variances may be necessary, based on the proposed use (variance requests approved at Board of Zoning Appeals on March 16, 2015). Obtaining well/septic permits from Outagamie County would be needed for residential use, until such time that City sewer and water becomes available.
- Fire Department Comments: The area in question is remote from City resources, and as a result, challenges Fire Department crew in two factors: (1) ability to deliver suitable water supply for reactive, life-preserving operations, and (2) getting a minimum of 14 fire-trained personnel in 8 minutes or less due to the geographical location. Emergency responses are drastically different to a home versus a storage structure. If the development of a home progresses without the benefit of City water, the Fire Chief will consider entering into an agreement which involves automatic fire sprinklers (which can be supported with private well water) that shall be monitored for flow activation with an electronic signal.

Written Public Comments: No questions, concerns, or comments have been received from the surrounding neighborhood.

### **RECOMMENDATION**

Staff recommends, based upon the standards for zoning map amendments as required by Section 23-65(d)(3) of the Zoning Ordinance, that Rezoning Application #3-15 to rezone the subject site located east of North Meade Street (part of parcel #31-1-9310-15) from AG Agricultural District to R-1A Single-Family District, as shown on the attached map, **BE APPROVED.**

### **GENERAL INFORMATION**

**Applicant:** Appleton Downtown, Inc. (ADI) c/o Jennifer Stephany

Location: College Avenue between Badger Avenue and Drew Street

**Applicant's Request:** The applicant is requesting permission to hang twenty-one (21) 30" x 70" interchangeable banners on light poles, utilizing existing brackets that hang in the public right-of-way a minimum of eight (8) feet above the sidewalk, along College Avenue between Badger Avenue and Drew Street.

### **BACKGROUND**

The original request by ADI for placement of banners was reviewed and approved by the City in 2002. These were installed in 2002-2003. In 2005, replacement banners featuring the "Downtown Cool" branding were reviewed and approved. The current request is part of ADI's recent efforts to launch the new "One Great Place" brand image and slogan for the downtown. As proposed, the new banners will replace those that are currently installed.

### **STAFF ANALYSIS**

Staff review is based on the City policy for banners in the right-of-way and Section 23-562 of the Municipal Code.

1. Requests for installation of banners must be made either by a recognized agency representing the area or from a two-thirds majority of the properties along the proposed route.

ADI is a recognized agency representing the Downtown Business Improvement District.

2. All banners and necessary brackets (including replacement parts) to be supplied by the requesting agency.

ADI is providing the new banners. These will replace the current banners and utilize the existing brackets located on light poles.

3. Storage of banners to be the responsibility of the requesting party.

ADI will purchase the new banners and store them until Department of Public Works staff is available to perform the installation. Once removed, the current banners will be returned to ADI.

4. Requesting parties must designate an individual to serve as the contact person with the City.

Jennifer Stephany, Executive Director of ADI, will be the contact person.

5. Banners may be installed only in areas that are predominantly commercial zoning.

The zoning is CBD Central Business District.

6. Banner installation should be consistent with planning and development policies, represent an appropriate theme, and not detract from the aesthetics of an area. Plans for banner installation, including color scheme, theme, and spacing must be approved by the Community and Economic Development Department and Plan Commission before being forwarded to the Municipal Services Committee for issuance of a permit.

This request essentially is an amendment/adjustment to the original request for banner placement, which was approved in 2002. As proposed, the new banners will hang on light poles utilizing the existing brackets, so the spacing will remain as it is currently. The colors, text, and graphics are intended to represent the new "One Great Place" brand image and slogan for the downtown.

7. Banner materials (including the brackets) must be approved by the Department of Public Works.

The Department of Public Works has reviewed and approved the new replacement banners that will utilize existing brackets.

8. Banner installation may be done by the Department of Public Works or by private contract. If a private contractor is used, installation plans showing bracket locations and elevations must be provided and approved by the Department of Public Works.

Installation will be done by the Department of Public Works, with maintenance and upkeep being performed by ADI.

9. If performed by the Department of Public Works, the cost of initial banner and bracket installation will be divided equally between the applicant and the City (exclusive of materials).

Initial banner and bracket installation was done by the Department of Public Works in 2002-2003. Since the existing brackets will be utilized, there will be no cost associated with bracket installation.

10. All costs of repair or replacement of banners done by the Department of Public Works will be charged to the requesting agency or designated individual as they are incurred.

ADI will supply any new or replacement banners.

11. The cost of changeover of banners done by the Department of Public Works will be divided equally between the applicant and the City up to a maximum of twice per year after which all costs will be borne by the applicant.

In 2005, when replacement banners were put up, the cost for banner instillation was divided equally between ADI and the City. With this current request, ADI has asked the City to waive the cost for banner installation. The cost waiver request will be discussed at the Municipal Services Committee meeting.

12. Banners will remain the property of the requesting agency.

ADI will retain ownership of the banners.

13. The requesting agency will be given 30-day notice of deteriorated banners (in the judgment of the City) after which they will be removed, and the cost of removal will be billed to the requesting agency or designated individual.

If this is needed, it will be done.

14. Installation of items budgeted by the City for installation is exempt from this policy (angels, flags, etc.).

This does not apply.

**Review Criteria:** Based upon the above analysis, it would appear the criteria established by the City policy for banners in the right-of-way and Section 23-562 has been satisfied.

**Appleton Comprehensive Plan 2010-2030:** Listed below are related excerpts from the City's *Comprehensive Plan 2010-2030*.

Chapter 14 Downtown Plan, Initiative 1 Urban Design:

Strategy 1.4 – Implement streetscaping projects to create downtown "identity streets."

- Continue streetscaping efforts on College Avenue, Richmond Street, and Appleton Street.
- Provide continued maintenance and replacement of streetscaping elements.

**Technical Review Group (TRG) Report:** This item was discussed at the April 21, 2015 Technical Review Group meeting. No negative comments were received from participating departments.

### **RECOMMENDATION**

Based on the above, staff recommends that the Appleton Downtown, Inc. request to have twenty-one (21) interchangeable banners on light poles, which would hang in the public right-of-way a minimum of eight (8) feet above the sidewalk, along College Avenue between Badger Avenue and Drew Street, **BE APPROVED** and forwarded to the Municipal Services Committee.





**Parcel #:** Part of 31-1-7600-00

**Petitioner's Request:** The owner/applicant is proposing to subdivide property under a multi-phased

approach.

### **BACKGROUND**

The Preliminary Plat for the Second Addition to Emerald Valley was approved by the Common Council on March 4, 2015.

Rezoning #11-14 to rezone the subject site from AG Agricultural District to R-1B Single-Family District was approved by the Common Council on February 4, 2015.

The Final Plat for the First Addition to Emerald Valley consisting of 3 residential lots was approved by the Common Council on June 2, 2010.

The Final Plat for Emerald Valley consisting of 50 residential lots was approved by the Common Council on June 6, 2007.

The subject property was annexed to the City in 2004 as part of the French Road Annexation, and a zoning classification of AG Agricultural District was assigned at that time. In 2005, a preliminary plat had been submitted for the overall property, which called for the creation of a total of 252 residential lots.

### STAFF ANALYSIS

**Existing Conditions:** The portion of the lot to be subdivided is currently undeveloped and zoned R-1B Single-Family District. The area being platted for single family development is 14.178 acres which will be divided into 27 lots.

**Comparison Between Final Plat and Preliminary Plat:** The Final Plat is consistent with the Preliminary Plat layout for these twenty-seven (27) lots in terms of shape, size, and location.

**Zoning Ordinance Review Criteria:** Lot development standards (Section 23-93) are as follows:

• Minimum lot area: Six thousand (6,000) square feet.

- The proposed lots range in size from 11,620 square feet to 41,984 square feet. All lots exceed this requirement.
- Minimum lot width: Fifty (50) feet.
  - o The proposed lots range in width from 68 feet to 204 feet. All lots exceed this requirement.
- Minimum front, side and rear yard setbacks: Twenty (20) foot front yard on a local street; Twenty-five (25) front yard on an arterial street; Six (6) foot side yard; and Twenty-five (25) foot rear yard.
  - Required front yard setback had been shown on the Preliminary Plat. Required setbacks will be reviewed through the building permit review process.
- Maximum building height: Thirty-five (35) feet.
  - This will be reviewed through the building permit review process.
- Maximum lot coverage. Fifty percent (50%).
  - o This will be reviewed through the building permit review process.

**Compliance with the Appleton Subdivision Regulations**: This subdivision complies with the Appleton Subdivision Regulations, and no variances have been requested.

Access and Traffic: The new vehicular access point to this phase is via Amethyst Drive and Bluetopaz Drive, which connects to Providence Avenue and then to Edgewood Drive. Amethyst Drive and Bluetopaz Drive will be designated as local streets with a 60 foot road right-of-way, and Providence Avenue will be designated as a collector street with a 66 foot road right-of-way. The full road right-of-way width of these public streets will be dedicated to the City with the Final Plat.

**Surrounding Zoning and Land Uses:** The surrounding area is under the jurisdiction of the City of Appleton (north, south, east and west) and Grand Chute (east). The uses are generally residential and agricultural in nature.

**2010-2030** Comprehensive Plan: Community Development staff has reviewed this proposed subdivision and determined it is compatible with the One and Two-Family Residential uses shown on the City's 2010-2030 Comprehensive Plan Future Land Use Map.

**Parks and Open Space:** The Appleton Subdivision Regulations do require parkland dedication or fee in lieu for residential subdivisions. The parkland fees pursuant to Chapter 17 of the Appleton Municipal Code have been waived, in exchange for parkland as part of the original Emerald Valley Development Agreement.

**Technical Review Group Report (TRG):** This item was discussed at the March 17, 2015 Technical Review Group Report meeting. No negative comments were received from participating departments.





Tax Incremental Financing District (TIF) #5 was created on January 1, 1999. The small District consisted mainly of the north side of Wisconsin Avenue bounded by Gillett Street on the west and Bennett Street on the east. The District spurred the development of the Bell Heights plaza on Wisconsin Avenue along with other smaller projects. The base equalized value of the TIF at the time it was formed was \$4,669,500. The equalized value on January 1, 2014 was \$12,046,700. Financially, the District has accumulated an excess fund balance of \$582,652 as of December 31, 2014.

In April, 2015, the final debt service payments will be made on the general obligation notes issued to fund District expenditures. Since there are no remaining project costs anticipated, and no further debt service remains, Wisconsin Statutes require the district be terminated and no further tax increments be certified. Per TIF Statutes, the initial step in terminating a TIF is to have a termination resolution approved by the governing body of the municipality.

As noted in the resolution, once approved, the Wisconsin Department of Revenue will be notified of the termination, a final independent audit of the District will be performed, and any excess tax increments collected will be distributed to the taxing districts.

The Engineering Division has opened bids for Units W-15 and X-15, our two large sewer and water main reconstruction projects for 2015. These projects share similar capital construction funding accounts in sanitary sewer (5431), storm sewer (5230), and water main (5371). After reviewing the bid totals for both projects, we will be able to award both contracts as bid, including a 4% contingency on each contract, while still staying within our overall funding allocations for accounts 5230 and 5431. However, in order to allow for the 4% contingency, we could develop a potential negative fund balance of approximately \$90,000.00 within water account 5371.

We are anticipating that the project contingencies will not be utilized, therefore avoiding the negative fund balance. However, if the contingency funds are needed, it would be our intent to utilize a small portion of our 2015 funding for AMI water meter replacements to offset these costs.

Therefore, we recommend award of:

Unit W-15 Sewer & Water Reconstruction No. 1 to Van Straten Construction in the amount of \$2,496,405.00 with a 4.0% contingency of \$100,000.00 for a project total not to exceed \$2,596,405.00.

-and -

Unit X-15 Sewer & Water Reconstruction No. 2 to Dorner, Inc. in the amount of \$1,841,938.00 with a 4.0% contingency of \$73,000.00 for a project total not to exceed \$1,914,938.00

As part of these contract awards, we are also requesting permission for the following:

- To postpone the water main replacement on **Sanders Street** between Seymour Street and Verbrick Street. The Engineering Division is planning to move the surface improvements for this street further back in our 5-year plan and would like to re-program the water main work to a later date to coincide with this change. Due to these planned changes, the Sanders Street water main work was not included in the bid packages for either of these projects.
- To retain spending authority for the Sanders Street water main construction (\$103,425.00) for use on Projects W-15 and X-15 (the funding and contract award scenario described above is based on this assumption).

The Engineering Division has opened bids for Units W-15 and X-15, our two large sewer and water main reconstruction projects for 2015. These projects share similar capital construction funding accounts in sanitary sewer (5431), storm sewer (5230), and water main (5371). After reviewing the bid totals for both projects, we will be able to award both contracts as bid, including a 4% contingency on each contract, while still staying within our overall funding allocations for accounts 5230 and 5431. However, in order to allow for the 4% contingency, we could develop a potential negative fund balance of approximately \$90,000.00 within water account 5371.

We are anticipating that the project contingencies will not be utilized, therefore avoiding the negative fund balance. However, if the contingency funds are needed, it would be our intent to utilize a small portion of our 2015 funding for AMI water meter replacements to offset these costs.

Therefore, we recommend award of:

Unit W-15 Sewer & Water Reconstruction No. 1 to Van Straten Construction in the amount of \$2,496,405.00 with a 4.0% contingency of \$100,000.00 for a project total not to exceed \$2,596,405.00.

-and -

Unit X-15 Sewer & Water Reconstruction No. 2 to Dorner, Inc. in the amount of \$1,841,938.00 with a 4.0% contingency of \$73,000.00 for a project total not to exceed \$1,914,938.00

As part of these contract awards, we are also requesting permission for the following:

- To postpone the water main replacement on **Sanders Street** between Seymour Street and Verbrick Street. The Engineering Division is planning to move the surface improvements for this street further back in our 5-year plan and would like to re-program the water main work to a later date to coincide with this change. Due to these planned changes, the Sanders Street water main work was not included in the bid packages for either of these projects.
- To retain spending authority for the Sanders Street water main construction (\$103,425.00) for use on Projects W-15 and X-15 (the funding and contract award scenario described above is based on this assumption).

The Engineering Division has opened bids for Units W-15 and X-15, our two large sewer and water main reconstruction projects for 2015. These projects share similar capital construction funding accounts in sanitary sewer (5431), storm sewer (5230), and water main (5371). After reviewing the bid totals for both projects, we will be able to award both contracts as bid, including a 4% contingency on each contract, while still staying within our overall funding allocations for accounts 5230 and 5431. However, in order to allow for the 4% contingency, we could develop a potential negative fund balance of approximately \$90,000.00 within water account 5371.

We are anticipating that the project contingencies will not be utilized, therefore avoiding the negative fund balance. However, if the contingency funds are needed, it would be our intent to utilize a small portion of our 2015 funding for AMI water meter replacements to offset these costs.

Therefore, we recommend award of:

Unit W-15 Sewer & Water Reconstruction No. 1 to Van Straten Construction in the amount of \$2,496,405.00 with a 4.0% contingency of \$100,000.00 for a project total not to exceed \$2,596,405.00.



#### **BACKGROUND:**

Among the chemicals stored at the AWTF for various treatment purposes, sodium hypochlorite is utilized as a cleaning and disinfection chemical. Sodium hypochlorite is housed in three (3) 10,000 gallon fiberglass-reinforced plastic (FRP) bulk sodium hypochlorite storage tanks. The bulk storage tanks were originally manufactured by Raven Industries and installed as part of new construction in 2001. Over the past few years, small leaks have been detected at flange and pipe penetrations. Given the age of the tanks (15 years of service life) and the aggressive nature of chemical it is housing, it was determined that a conditions assessment be performed as soon as reasonably possible on one of the three sodium hypochlorite tanks. The assessment will critically evaluate the structural integrity of the tank to determine if repairs can be made or if tank replacement is necessary.

As part of the conditions assessment the contractor will conduct an internal and external examination of one tank and document flaws and defects in accordance with applicable ASTM standards and industry accepted practices. It should be noted that another project may be developed later in the year in regards to a second hypochlorite tank which is also in need of repairs. The Utilities Department did not include the second tank as part of this Request for Quotation (RFQ) because the project approach could be modified based on the findings and recommendations of the first conditions assessment. As part of the conditions assessment, the contractor will compile the findings of the inspection with supporting photographs in a report or technical memorandum format that includes conclusions, recommendations, and associated budgetary estimates. Subsequent repair work is dependent on the findings and conclusions within the conditions assessment.

Therefore, the costs for those tasks as part of the quotations process were included as "required alternates" but included in the total award amount.

#### **QUOTE PROCESS:**

Five qualified firms were selected based upon their ability to provide essential assessment and repair services described in the RFQ. Only two firms provided a complete quote for all requested services. Schedule availability and in-house service capabilities to meet all required alternate scope services described within the RFQ were reasons given by those who did not provide a quotation. A summary of quotations is found below.



#### **BACKGROUND**

The City of Appleton Water Treatment Facility (AWTF) has four water softeners that require extensive maintenance approximately every 12 years to protect steel components from corrosion and to extend the life of the equipment. To date, two softeners have completed these maintenance activities. The Utility has a planned budget to complete the final two softeners by 2016. The 2015 budget for softener painting is \$225,000.

Similar to water tower painting, engineering services are necessary to provide project oversight to ensure high quality and a long term coating system. Engineering services for this project include system evaluation, preparation of plans and specifications, contract administration services, and field services. This project will require a National Association of Corrosion Engineers (NACE) or a structural engineer with a Professional Engineering (PE) license who has considerable knowledge of structural steel mechanical equipment and corrosion resistant coating systems.

#### **PROPOSALS**

The Appleton Water Plant received four proposals for project engineering services. Robert E. Lee and Associates proposal was deemed the proposal that best matched services required for this project. Robert E. Lee scored high because they had a team of engineers and technicians that routinely performed this type of project work. The team reviewed services provided by McMahon but did not consider their proposal a match for this project work. The following table summarizes the firms quotes.












#### BICYCLE AND PEDESTRIAN BACKGROUND INFORMATION

VISION: Ensure that residents within the Appleton (Fox Cities)
Transportation Managament Area (TMA) and Oshkosh Metropolitan
Planning Organizations (MPOs) have the ability to safely and conveniently
walk or bike between origins and destinations via a well interconnected
multimodal transportation network.

Bicyclists and pedestrians do not adhere to municipal boundaries; therefore it is imperative this bicycle and pedestrian plan focuses on connecting all of the municipalities of the Fox Cities (Appleton) and Oshkosh Metropolitan Planning Organizations (MPOs). Although a multitude of municipal bicycle and pedestrian plans have been completed throughout the three county area of Calumet, Outagamie, and Winnebago Counties, there currently is not a plan that focuses on the regional connectivity of bicycle and pedestrian networks throughout the study area. This plan not only identifies existing and planned facilities, but identifies gaps, barriers, and needed connections to enhance the safe, accessible and efficient regional bicycle and pedestrian network throughout and in between the two urbanized areas. Most transit trips begin and/or end with a pedestrian trip, so connectivity with Valley Transit and GO Transit buses, which include bicycle racks, are also addressed in this plan.

This plan has been a coordinated regional effort for three counties (Calumet, Outagamie, and Winnebago) with a population of over 200,000, twenty-five municipalities, 20 school districts, and 100 schools. This plan focuses on regional bicycle and pedestrian connectivity yet, it strives to keep individual characteristics of a community intact. Funding for this project was received from the Wisconsin Department of Transportation.

#### **BENEFITS OF BICYCLING AND WALKING**

#### **Economic:**

 In 2010, a study found that bicycle recreation and tourism contribute \$924 million annually to Wisconsin's economy and estimates that "the potential value of health benefits from reducing short car trips and increasing bicycling totaled \$409 million".

#### **Real Estate Values:**

 Bob McNamara, Senior Policy Representative for the National Association of Realtors (NAR), a 1.2 million member professional organization, emphasized the importance of transportation choice at the 2009 National Bike Summit. Realtors sell not just houses, he said, they sell communities. Increasing transportation choice increases livability.

#### Health:

- People living in auto-oriented suburbs drive more, walk less and are more obese than people living in walkable communities. For each hour of driving per day, obesity increases 6%, but walking for transportation reduces the risk of obesity.
- Today, approximately one-quarter of health care costs in the U.S. are attributable to obesity and health care costs for childhood obesity are estimated at approximately \$14 billion per year.
- Obesity is so prevalent in today's children, that this maybe the first generation of children in over 200 years that may not outlive their parents.

#### **Environmental/Congestion Management:**

- Returning to 1969 levels of walking and bicycling to school would save 3.2 billion vehicle miles, 1.5 million tons of carbon dioxide and 89,000 tons of other pollutants equal to keeping more than 250,000 cars off the road for a year.
- A 5% increase in a neighborhood's "walkability" reduces vehicle miles traveled by 6%.


- Pedestrians are twice as likely to be struck by a vehicle in locations without a sidewalk.
- Seniors are the most vulnerable bicyclists and pedestrians. Adults over 65 make up 10% of walking trips, yet comprise 19% of pedestrian fatalities and make up 6% of bicycling trips, yet account for 10% of bicycle fatalities.



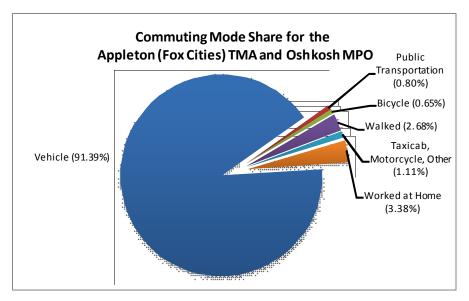

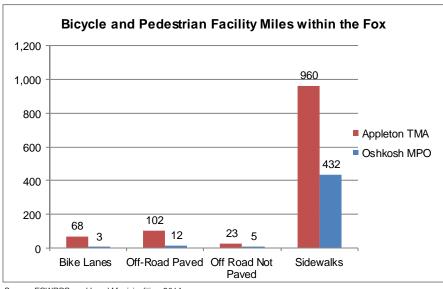
#### **CURRENT CONDITIONS ANAYLSIS**



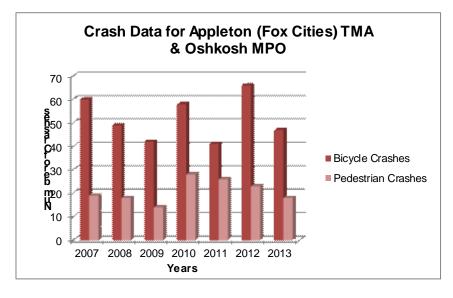

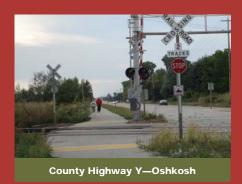

## FUNDING, FINANCING, AND IMPLEMENTATION

Local municipalities should consider funding and financing bicycle and pedestrian facilities during their improvement capital program process. As roadway projects come through the local municipalities' capital improvement program, bicycle and pedestrian facilities should be considered. It is easier to develop in bicycle and pedestrian accommodations versus retrofitting pedestrian bicvcle and accommodations after a roadway has recently been reconstructed.

State and federal grant programs should be used to supplement local funds in the development of bicycle and pedestrian facilities. However it should be noted that if communities awarded state or federal grant funds for bicycle and pedestrian accommodations that state and federal requirements will need to be met with the project. Typically state and federal grants will require a local match.

#### RECOMMENDATIONS

#### ~ Education ~

Increase public and political awareness of the need for the benefits of bicycle and pedestrian facilities and a well interconnected multimodal transportation network.

- Establish an annual report on the state of walking and bicycling including but not limited to miles
  of facilities, number of programs, and policies within the region.
- Educate drivers (including young drivers) about interacting/sharing the road with cyclists and pedestrians.
- Calculate benefits of local projects (i.e. economics, health, etc.).
- Partner with local parks and recreation departments and schools to offer summer bicycling classes.
- Work with local municipalities to develop site visits for elected officials to experience walking or bicycling.

#### ~ Encouragement ~

Encourage more residents to walk and/or bike as a means to reduce dependence on the automobile, conserve energy, and increase physical activity.

- Continue to work with local organizations and municipalities to expand and promote the Fox Valley Bike Challenge.
- Provide bicycle parking at local businesses, employment centers, recreational facilities, etc.
- Establish an information website or app showing routes and locations of bicycling and walking facilities.
- Develop walking school bus programs and/or cycle trains with local schools.
- Work with local organizations and municipalities to develop a Cyclovia (an event that closes the streets temporarily for bicycle and pedestrian use only—Ride the Drive in Madison).

#### ~ Enforcement ~

Improve safety, reduce conflicts, and build mutual awareness and respect between motorists, bicyclists, and pedestrians by improving enforcement of all multimodal transportation laws.

- Partner with local law enforcement in bicycle and pedestrian education efforts.
- Work with local police departments and other organizations to develop a bicycle patrol program.
- Work with local law enforcement to provide positive reinforcement of "Doing It Right" with residents and youth.
- Develop a Pedestrian Enforcement Campaign.

#### ~ Engineering ~

Improve the connections between bicycle, pedestrian, and transit networks within the Appleton (Fox Cities) and Oshkosh Urbanized Areas by identifying gaps, barriers and needed multimodal facilities.

- Develop the Regional Bicycle and Pedestrian Network.
- Develop Complete Streets Policies for communities within the Appleton (Fox Cities) and Oshkosh MPOs.

Members of the Board shall have a demonstrated interest or competence in the field of public health or community health, and a good faith effort shall be made to appoint a registered nurse and physician.
