Whereas, communities as vibrant as Appleton are a destination for residents and visitors alike a place where people don't just live and work, but thrive. And

Whereas, riding a bike is a healthy, fun and safe activity. And

**Whereas,** Appleton has currently, 14.3 centerline-miles of bike lanes and are planning to add an additional 9.3 miles over the next five years. And

Whereas, Appleton has 8.0 miles of side paths (paths located in road rights-of-way that run parallel to roadways). We are planning to add at least an additional 2.3 miles over the next five years. And

**Whereas,** Appleton has 9.2 miles of public trails, which includes Apple Creek, North Island, Providence, Newberry, and Highview Trails. And

Whereas, we are planning to add in the next 3-10 years: The Trolley Trestle Trail from Atlas Mill to Pullmans, Lutz Park to Vulcan Heritage, Foremost Trestle Trail and Lawrence University connection, Riverview Gardens connecting Veterans Park to Olde Oneida Street and Newberry Trail, and Plamann Park to Apple Hill Trail. And

Whereas, bicycle advocates have fought hard for the right to the road and continue to shape our traffic laws to better accommodate people on bikes and all multimodal transportation choices, And

**Now, Therefore, Be It Resolved** that Appleton continues to grow our biking and walking community and plans to employ a shared employee in 2017 between Departments of Public Works and Park and Recreation to develop new programs, seek and apply for grants, enhance accommodations, and continue to make the City of Appleton a more bicycle and pedestrian friendly community. RE: Erb Park and Pool Questions and Answers by Committee

At the April 25<sup>th</sup> Parks and Recreation Committee meeting, the following questions were asked and I promised to follow-up on them. Director Vandehey and I met and have found the answers you need to the best of our knowledge.

- 1. Can we provide the number of times it was reported people went into our stormwater ponds? Zero.
- 2. Is DPW willing to cost share for the portion of stormwater from non Erb Park areas? Yes, DPW staff is willing to request an appropriate budget adjustment. Director Vandehey, Director Saucerman and I met and money will be budgeted to pay for the stormwater needs coming from areas other than Erb Park.
- 3. What is the cost to do underground storage? Our consultant estimated \$1.5 \$2 million. DPW feels very comfortable with the consultant's estimate of \$1.5 \$2 million based on the Appleton East Project.
- 4. What changed in the stormwater policy approved this last April? The only changes to the Ordinance that have an impact on this project are (1) the consultant needs to analyze and report out the phosphorous, but no treatment is required and (2) there are new runoff curve numbers and rainfall intensities that are required to be used in the modeling.
- 5. What do we have to do in regards to stormwater and is anything optional? QUANTITY we have to bring peak discharge to its pre-settlement condition. QUALITY we need to reduce Total Suspended Solids by 80% or Maximum Extent Practicable (MEP). No infiltration or protective areas.

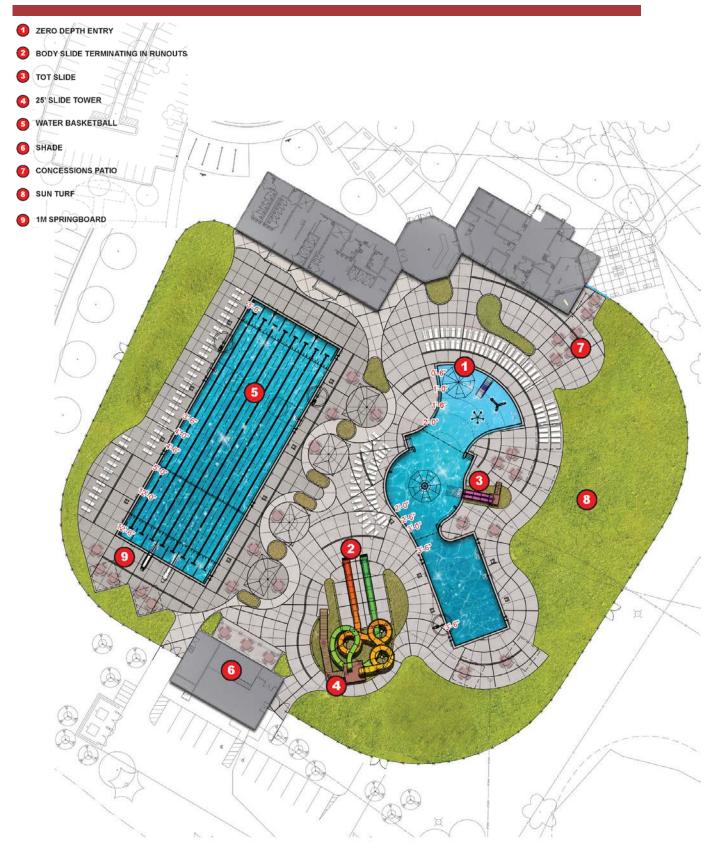
