assessed as Single Family.

The Special Assessment Policy, adopted by the City Council annually, establishes assessment rates based on zoning, not usage. This philosophy has been debated many times over the 100 plus years of our Assessment Policy. The policy has continued to be based on zoning as it is an easily documented way to levy assessments versus use which could change without documentation (i.e. the City's parcel information includes a zoning category, but not a use category).



We the property owners of the 200 block of No Fair St., whose property use does not match the more commercial zoning classification of (R-3) and (CBD) are being asked to pay costly tax assessments for the recent installment of storm water sewer mains and laterals on our street. Although all of us own either single or two family residences, we have been zoned either (R-3) or (CBD). But the present and past use of our properties clearly match the zoning code of either (R-1) or (R-2). This is the case for all properties fronting both sides of the 200 block of N. Fair St. Please Keep in mind that property owners throughout the city who are actually zoned (P-1) or (P-2) are not required to pay for new storm water mains and laterals. So then, should you require us to pay for the same improvements because we falling misfit zoning condition that includes the whole 200 block of N. Fair St.? We do not enjoy added value for being zoned (R-3) and (CBD). You won't find any Businesses on our little street. Also, the median property value for our residences on the 200 block of Ni Fair St. are certainly below the median value for residential properties city wide . Yes. It's true that our properties are zoned (R-3) and (CBD). But then again, our properties do not match that zoning description.

In light of this discrepancy that includes all the residential properties on the 200 block of N. Fair St., we believe it is reasonable to ask the city for a reduction of our tax assessments for the storm water sewer mains and storm water laterals. We are suggesting a reduction of at least 50 percent. Thankyou for considering our petition.

The Appleton Fire Department maintains Hazardous Materials (Haz-Mat) Response Team contracts for Outagamie and Calumet Counties as well as with the State of Wisconsin for a Type II Team and a Radiological Field Survey Team. As part of the Haz-Mat Team capabilities, it is necessary to maintain response vehicles. One of the tow vehicles (Ford F250) is at its ten-year life span and due for replacement. The replacement vehicle (Ford F350) will have a larger engine for better/safer towing capability of one of the 22' Haz-Mat Response trailers.

Utilizing the dealership list maintained by CEA, four vendors were asked to provide a quote with only two vendors responding as follows:

Les Stumpf Ford	Ford F350 XLT, 4 x 4 Crew Cab	\$46,105.50
L & S Truck Center	Ford F350 XLT 4 x 4 Crew Cab	\$54,195.50

Therefore, the Appleton Fire Department is recommending the purchase of the haz-mat replacement truck from Les Stumpf Ford in Appleton. Thank you!

AN ORDINANCE CREATING SECTION 2-29 OF CHAPTER 2 ARTICLE II OF THE MUNICIPAL CODE OF THE CITY OF APPLETON, RELATING TO
ADMINISTRATION - COMMON COUNCIL. (Finance Committee –)
The Common Council of the City of Appleton does ordain as follows:
Section 1: That Section 2-29 of Chapter 2, Article II, of the Municipal Code of the City
of Appleton, relating to Administration, Common Council, is hereby created to read as follows:
Sec. 2-29. Alderperson absence; participation electronically.
(a) An alderperson, who is a qualified individual with a disability as defined in s. 35.104, Code of Federal Regulations, Title 28, Chapter 1, Section 3, unable to appear in person at a meeting of the Common Council may request in writing or by email at least twenty-four (24) hours in advance of the meeting the written or emailed permission from the President of the Common Council to participate in the meeting electronically. The participation by an alderperson electronically shall be permitted in cases where extreme temperatures would negatively impact adaptive equipment used by the person either on their person or as a mode of transporation. An alderperson's appearance electronically must be noted in the meeting minutes. Electronic participation must occur in the meeting room so that the physically absent member can hear and can be heard by all those who are present. An alderperson appearing electronically shall be entitled to participate and vote to the fullest extent possible.
(b) Notwithstanding paragraph (a) above, an alderperson participating electronically in a fact finding hearing shall not vote on any matter that may require observation of any part of the proceeding, including the demeanor of a witness or viewing exhibits not previously provided.
(c) An alderperson participating electronically shall not count towards a quorum.
Section 2: This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and
publication.

Illegal use of drugs means the use of one or more drugs, the possession or distribution of which is unlawful under the Controlled Substances Act (21 U.S.C. 812). The term illegal use of drugs does not include the use of a drug taken under supervision by a licensed health care professional, or other uses authorized by the Controlled Substances Act or other provisions of Federal law.

Individual with a disability means a person who has a disability. The term individual with a disability does not include an individual who is currently engaging in the illegal use of drugs, when the public entity acts on the basis of such use.

Other power-driven mobility device means any mobility device powered by batteries, fuel, or other engines—whether or not designed primarily for use by individuals with mobility disabilities—that is used by individuals with mobility disabilities for the purpose of locomotion, including golf cars, electronic personal assistance mobility devices (EPAMDs), such as the Segway® PT, or any mobility device designed to operate in areas without defined pedestrian routes, but that is not a wheelchair within the meaning of this section. This definition does not apply to Federal wilderness areas; wheelchairs in such areas are defined in section 508(c)(2) of the ADA, 42 U.S.C. 12207(c)(2).

Public entity means—

- Any State or local government;
- (2) Any department, agency, special purpose district, or other instrumentality of a State or States or local government; and
- (3) The National Railroad Passenger Corporation, and any commuter authority (as defined in section 103(8) of the Rail Passenger Service Act).

Qualified individual with a disability means an individual with a disability who, with or without reasonable modifications to rules, policies, or practices, the removal of architectural, communication, or transportation barriers, or the provision of auxiliary aids and services, meets the essential eligibility requirements for the receipt of services or the participation in programs or activities provided by a public entity.

Qualified interpreter means an interpreter who, via a video remote interpreting (VRI) service or an on-site appearance, is able to interpret effectively, accurately, and impartially, both receptively and expressively, using any necessary specialized vocabulary. Qualified interpreters include, for example, sign language interpreters, oral transliterators, and cued-language transliterators.

Qualified reader means a person who is able to read effectively, accurately, and impartially using any necessary specialized vocabulary.

Section 504 means section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 (Pub. L. 93-112, 87 Stat. 394 (29 U.S.C. 794)), as amended.

Service animal means any dog that is individually trained to do work or perform tasks for the benefit of an individual with a disability, including a physical, sensory, psychiatric, intellectual, or other mental disability. Other species of animals, whether wild or domestic, trained or untrained, are not service animals for the purposes of this definition. The work or tasks performed by a service animal must be directly related to the individual's disability. Examples of work or tasks include, but are not limited to, assisting individuals who are blind or have low vision with navigation and other tasks, alerting individuals who are deaf or hard of hearing to the presence of people or sounds, providing non-violent protection or rescue work, pulling a wheelchair, assisting an individual during a seizure, alerting individuals to the presence of allergens, retrieving items such as medicine or the telephone, providing physical support and assistance with balance and stability to individuals with mobility disabilities, and helping persons with psychiatric and neurological disabilities by preventing or interrupting impulsive or destructive behaviors. The crime deterrent effects of an animal's presence and the provision of emotional support, well-being, comfort, or companionship do not constitute work or tasks for the purposes of this definition.

State means each of the several States, the District of Columbia, the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico, Guam, American Samoa, the Virgin Islands, the Trust Territory of the Pacific Islands, and the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands.

Video remote interpreting (VRI) service means an interpreting service that uses video conference technology over dedicated lines or wireless technology offering high-speed, wide-bandwidth video connection that delivers high-quality video images as provided in §35.160(d).

Wheelchair means a manually-operated or power-driven device designed primarily for use by an individual with a mobility disability for the main purpose of indoor or of both indoor and outdoor locomotion. This definition does not apply to Federal wilderness areas; wheelchairs in such areas are defined in section 508(c)(2) of the ADA, 42 U.S.C. 12207(c)(2).

The 2016 Capital Improvement Plan includes upgrading the exterior lighting at City Park to LED. Construction contract 59-16 was issued to Van Ert Electric Company, Inc. in the amount of \$87,500. The project has been completed. One Change order was issued in the amount of \$2,250 to install new underground conduit and wiring to the fountain. This contract is now complete as all punchlist items were completed.

The CIP budget is \$100,000. The final contract amount is \$89,750.

The Parks, Recreation and Facilities Management Department recommends issuing the final contract payment to Van Ert Electric Company, Inc. in the amount of \$4,487.50.
