While Marlowe was listed in 2 police reports, those reports did not list him as barking at, biting, or attacking any specific person. The only thing listed for Marlowe in these instances is that he charged at people.

Marlowe is a 2 ½ year old English Mastiff. Marlowe loves to run and play. He has interacted with other dogs and people at the Outagamie County dog park countless times and has been around my friends and family along with their children with no aggression noted. Marlowe has even interacted with my 2-year-old nephew(JJ) without any issues. Due to Marlowe's size(approx.150 lbs) and the way he runs, Marlowe running could be misconstrued as charging. Marlowe loves being around people and it's in his temperament to seek out for people's attention and affection.

We have found a new good home for Marlowe outside of the city where he will have more room to run and have less of a chance of disrupting the general public. I would like for Marlowe to not be deemed as a dangerous animal though based off these 2 reports and carry that reputation along with him to his new home. I am strongly urging you to reconsider your decision regarding him.
