#4-R-19 Bee City USA

WHEREAS, bees and other pollinators have experienced critical population declines due to a combination of habitat loss, poor nutrition, pesticides including neo-nics and other systemic insecticides, fungicides, and herbicides, parasites, diseases, and climate change; and

WHEREAS, supporting pollinators fosters broad-based community engagement in environmental awareness and sustainability and benefits local and regional economies through healthier ecosystems, increased vegetable and fruit crop yields, and an increased demand for pollinator-friendly plant materials from local growers; and WHEREAS, the City of Appleton's Municipal Code contains a comprehensive plan which uses "Smart Growth" principles as a framework for land-use decision making, including an Integrated Pest Management program, and establishes procedures for the conservation and effective management of natural resources, which include productive agricultural areas, environmentally sensitive areas, wetlands, wildlife habitat, parks and recreational resources, and stormwater retention ponds, and

WHEREAS, the City of Appleton's Health in All Policy Ordinance states that Stakeholder engagement is essential for ensuring that Health in All policies is responsive to community needs, and that the Appleton Pollinators, a community advocacy group, stands ready to provide such input; and

WHEREAS, the City of Appleton is in a unique position to leverage both its proven support of urban beekeeping practices, as well as its potential to significantly increase pollinator-friendly habitats on public lands, to encourage pollinator friendly weed control practices, and, most importantly, to incentivize its citizens to take direct and meaningful action on their own properties, and

WHEREAS, on June 21st of 2017, the Mayor of Appleton did proclaim, in recognition of the vital significance of protecting pollinator health, the third week in June National Pollinator Week, in Appleton, and did call upon its residents to celebrate the significance of pollinators with appropriate observances and activities, (Exhibit A) and WHEREAS, the mission of BEE CITY USA is to galvanize communities to sustain pollinators, responsible for the reproduction of almost 90% of the world's flowering plant species, by providing them with healthy habitat, rich in a variety of native plants and free to nearly free of pesticides.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE COMMON COUNCIL OF APPLETON, WISCONSIN, HEREBY RESOLVES, that the Mayor, or his designee, is authorized to apply for and accept designation to the BEE CITY USA program; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Mayor or his designee is authorized to take such actions, including those enumerated in attached Project participation and implementation with the BEE CITY USA program.
