To whom it may concern,

I am writing to formally object to the designation of my dog, Clyde, as a "dangerous dog" and to notify the Appleton Police Department of my intent to appear as requested to defend against this designation.

At the time of the incident, Clyde was in a secure, designated space specifically intended for his use. He was approached in a manner that was inappropriate and inconsistent with respecting his boundaries. The video shows that there were zero issues with the child and men present in the room before she entered. He was approached and hovered over with threatening body language. Notably, the individual admitted fault regarding her actions that led to the incident.

In order to properly prepare my defense, I respectfully request all documentation and evidence related to this matter, including but not limited to written statements, photographs, reports, and any other materials relied upon in considering this designation.

I take matters of public safety seriously and believe a full and fair review of the facts will demonstrate that Clyde does not meet the criteria for a dangerous dog designation. I look forward to addressing this matter formally and resolving it based on complete and accurate circumstances.
