Attempt. An attempt to commit a violation requires that the actor have an intent to perform acts and attain a result which, if accomplished, would constitute such violation and that the actor does act toward the commission of the violation which demonstrates unequivocally, under all the circumstances, that the actor

formed that intent and would commit the violation except for the intervention of another person or some extraneous factor.
